

## BORN TO READ NATIONAL PROGRAM

**Born to read** is a national program created in 1999, its goal is to promote the shared reading inside the family from the birth, because reding regularly to children has a positive influence on their intellectual, linguistic, emotional, and relational development, with significant effects throughout their lives.

- Child Health Center, which focuses on training, reserch and solidarity activities for children as part of its statuary aims

## HOW TO READ TO YOUR CHILD

- Choose a comfortable place where you can sit with your child in your lap
- Hold your book so that the child can see the pictures
- Explain and point to the pictures and repeat commonly used words
- Read with emotional involvement, because the first book is the face of the reader
- Set aside an **appropriate moment** during the day for reading and don't insist if the child doesn't enjoy it
- Remember that **attention spans** vary depending on age
- Do not refuse to read the same story repeatedly
- Keep a shelf with the child's books within an easy reach

Set aside a special moment in the day for reading (before naptime or bedtime, after meals), take advantage of waiting moments to read together (during travel, in the doctor's waiting room), and make a habit to visit the library and the bookshop with your child.

### But most importatly, remember:

if you love reading, your child will feel it, and they will love reading too.
